

# RESOLUTION

## DESIGNATING A SUGAR HILL HISTORY MUSEUM AND SUGAR HILL ART GALLERY

WHEREAS, the City of Sugar Hill is focused on building a sense of community and creating a sense of place for its many residents; and

WHEREAS, history and the arts play an important role in building community and creating a sense of place; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sugar Hill has a rich history that includes an early settler that fought in the Revolutionary War with George Washington, gold mines, and many other unique historical attributes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sugar Hill has a vibrant arts community with painters, muralists, writers, dancers, authors, musicians, and other forms of visual, cultural, and performance arts; and

WHEREAS, a Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society and a Sugar Hill Arts Commission exist and were created by the Mayor and City Council for the purpose of promoting history and the arts; and

WHEREAS, both the Society and the Commission have a desire for places to collect and display local items of historic and artistic importance; and

WHEREAS, these places shall be labeled in name and open to the public when residents are visiting City Hall; and

WHEREAS, these rooms shall continue to be open for use by other groups that need these places for meeting spaces and other purposes; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Sugar Hill renames its Community Room as the Sugar Hill History Museum and its Hospitality Room as the Sugar Hill Art Gallery.
