SPLOST: Your penny sales tax at work in Sugar Hill



The Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) has allowed the City to perform almost \$4,000,000 of maintenance and construction projects. For example, we have repaired and resurfaced over 12.5 miles of streets, constructed over 25,000 feet (4.7 miles) of new sidewalks to connect to schools and EE Robinson Park, purchased over 20 acres of additional park land, built a parking lot for 150 additional vehicles, constructed two recreation buildings and replaced two playgrounds.

Without SPLOST, these projects probably would not have been accomplished.

- The Comprehensive Plan for the City of Sugar Hill, after several reviews and input from citizens, has been sent to DCA for their approval. The plan must be re-adopted in ten years, and reviewed periodically.
