




Downtown Master Plan: New City Hall

The anchor for the new "downtown" will be a new City Hall. To be built on West Broad Street at the old Nu-Air site and within a realignment of Church Street and Temple Drive.

The new City Hall will be much larger to accommodate the future growth of the City and services. The site will be adjacent to the retention/detention pond amenity and to off street parking. We are planning for street trees, street lamps, benches, waste units and wide sidewalks with brick accents. We will be holding several meetings to solicit community input on the design of an early 20th century look for a City Hall. Comments and suggestions are welcomed and will be duly noted. We will have a variety of designs and sketches for critique.

The final grading going on in the photo is in preparation for the 255,000 sq ft of synthetic turf fields, the largest such fields in the entire Southeast.
