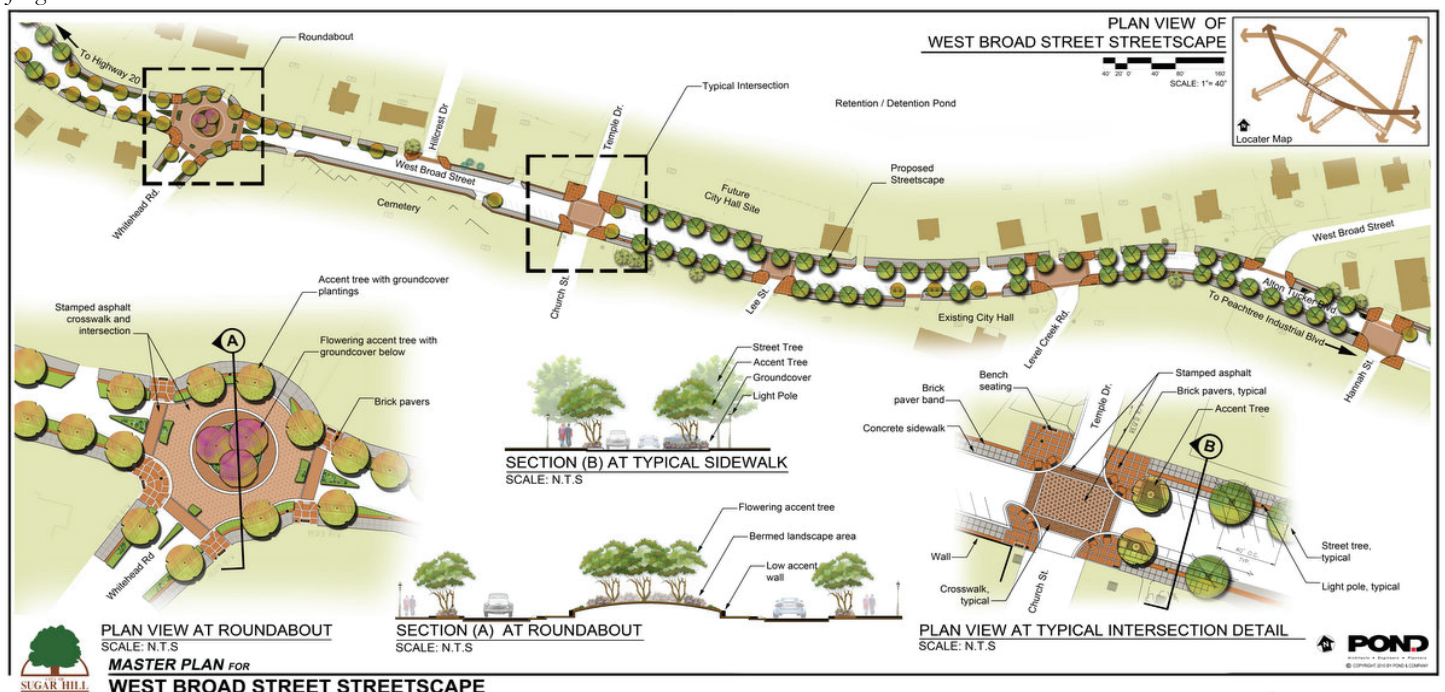




Sugar Hill Streetscape Groundbreaking

A major milestone in our future downtown plan is the start of the West Broad St. streetscape. The construction is well underway and when completed, the new street will be completely rebuilt with on street parking, wide sidewalks with brick accents, trees and our double globe streetlights. New water lines and underground utilities are also being installed. A roundabout at Whitehead Rd. will calm traffic and allow easy access from Whitehead to West Broad St. Groundbreaking for our new City Hall is scheduled for later this fall and will dovetail with the new street. Construction Watch: Streetscape



Significant development is underway on West Broad St. The photos show the installation of storm water drain pipes that will collect water runoff and direct it to the new detention/amenity pond under construction. The next photos are of a large machine that pulverizes asphalt to create a new roadbed. Sections of West Broad St. are closed to all traffic, and will be for several months. News Bites:

- Plaza Security is enforcing City Code violations throughout the City and issuing parking citations for illegal parking at our City parks. Due to the popularity of our parks, illegal vehicle parking has become an issue, especially on weekends. Please park in the Level Creek lot at EE Robinson Park and in the Gary Pirkle Park upper lot on Suwanee Dam Rd., or in the cleared lot across from the main entrance at Gary Pirkle Park.
- Sugar Hill is one of a few cities that proactively controls mosquito breeding grounds as a free service to our residents. We will continue mosquito spraying throughout August. The spray becomes inert when exposed to water or sunlight so the spraying is done in the evening when mosquitoes are active. The final round starts August 15th -19th, north of Hwy 20 and runs through August 22nd -26th, south of Hwy 20.
- The Sugar Hill Fall Festival is coming October 22nd at EE Robinson Park. We are looking for food vendors, craft vendors, Chili Cook Off participants and sponsors for this annual event. As a vendor you will be selling and promoting to over 5,000 attendees. The Festival has something for everyone rides, food, music with live bands on a stage, games, pony rides, a petting zoo and animal attractions.
