Getting to know: The City of Sugar Hill Stormwater Department. The City's Stormwater Department performs inspections for all new storm drain systems as well as maintenance of existing storm drain systems - including pipes, headwalls, catch basins, ponds, drop inlets, drainage ditches and yard inlets. This department is also responsible for any new construction or expansion of existing systems within the City. They perform monthly condition checks on structures to help prevent problems before they become costly issues and also perform dry weather screenings and source tracing. This not only ensures the quality of the water, but also helps in the prevention of possible illicit discharge. The Stormwater Department also handles all industrial and municipal inspections on businesses within the city limits making sure they comply with all City and E.P.A standards. Public Service Announcement for Sugar Hill Gas Customers

If you smell Gas **inside** your home: * Leave the house immediately! * Make an emergency call from a neighbor's home. * Do not take time to shut off valves or open windows. * Wait at the neighbors until a certified gas technician arrives. Make note of these numbers to call:

- 770-271-2137-Gas Department 7:00 am until 4:00 pm
- 770-945-6716-City Hall after 4:00 pm and on weekends
- If you are unable to remember these numbers call 911.

Sugar Hill operates a safe, well maintained underground gas system in accordance with all Federal Regulations. Any underground gas piping beyond the meter is the responsibility of the customer. Make sure any underground piping beyond the meter is properly maintained as the metallic pipes may be subject to corrosion. **Call before you dig - It's the law.** Please contact the Georgia One Call Center at (770) 623-4344 or 811, three days prior to digging in order for all utility owned buried pipe and cable to be located. This service is available free of charge. All digging should be carefully done by hand in the vicinity of the pipe. Please call the Sugar Hill Gas Department for information: (770) 271-2137
