City Hall "GRAND" Opening!

On Sunday January 13th, we welcomed the community to the ribbon cutting and grand opening of our new 33,000 sq. ft. City Hall. We couldn't have anticipated the huge crowd of more than 300 that turned out for the ceremony and to tour the facility. Even the weather cooperated with clear blue skies and a nice breeze. Beginning with the Invocation delivered by Rev. Chuck Allen, Pastor, Sugar Hill Church, a ceremonial raising of the flags was performed. Robert M. Hail, Col. U.S. Air Force (Retired), and William Ferguson, Jr., MSgt. U.S. Air Force (Retired), raised the U. S. Flag. The State Flag was raised by Cub Scout Pack 608 and Boy Scout Troops 513 and 608. The City Flag was raised by Girl Scout Troops 1202 & 4511. Mayor Gary Pirkle gave the welcoming remarks, thanking Precision Planning for the design of City Hall and Van Winkle/Reeves for the great job constructing City Hall. He also praised City staff for their work. Councilman Curtis Northrup introduced distinguished guests that included representatives from the Federal, State and local levels. Next we heard from Council Members Marc Cohen, Mike Sullivan, Susie Gajewski and Steve Edwards. They all spoke to the thought and planning that went into the development of such a magnificent facility. The Rev. Dr. Richard A. Hunter, Pastor, Sugar Hill United Methodist Church, delivered a prayer of Dedication. This was followed by the ribbon cutting, officially opening City Hall. Visitors were treated to tours, refreshments, cakes decorated with images of the new City Hall and an array of souvenirs including pins, mugs, commemorative coins and miniature City Flags.








News Bites:
