Sugar Hill Millage Rate

(All public hearings and meetings were held after press time of this newsletter)

In June of each year, the City Council of Sugar Hill votes on and adopts a millage rate for City property tax. The Council holds a series of (3) public meetings to discuss and determine this rate. The new rate is not adopted until there is a vote between your Elected Officials. The voting session to determine the new millage rate is scheduled for June 16, 2004.

The anticipated millage rate for property tax in Sugar Hill is 3.8, which is a continuance of last year's rate. If adopted, this will mean there will not be an increase in the millage rate, and unless you receive notice of reassessment from Gwinnett County your tax will not increase.
