HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION FOR REAL PROPERTY AND SENIOR CITIZEN EXEMPTION DEADLINE TO FILE MAY 1, 2006

All City of Sugar Hill property owners and senior citizen property owners who reside at the subject property can file for homestead exemptions at the Gwinnett County Justice Center between January 1st and May 1st of each year. No applications will be accepted after the deadline and there is no charge for this service. If you have filed previously with Gwinnett County, and have no ownership changes to your deed, there is no need to reapply each year.

Gwinnett County offers special homestead exemptions to eligible property owners, disabled, and senior citizens. The City of Sugar Hill also offers special exemptions to senior citizens. Special exemptions are based on age, disability and/or income. Therefore, you must bring a copy of your Federal and State Income Tax Return when applying for applications for special exemptions. You do not need your tax returns when applying for the Regular Homestead Exemption, only for Special Exemptions with income limitations.

The Gwinnett County Tax Assessor is located at 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville and their hours are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Their phone number is (770) 822-8800. Applying with the County automatically facilitates any applicable City of Sugar Hill exemptions since they collect property taxes for the City.

People who report littering should provide us with as much of the following information as possible:

- 1) Vehicle tag number
- 2) Where it happened
- 3) When it happened (day, approximate time)
- 4) What was tossed out of the car
- 5) Any physical description of the person who tossed the litter
