## Commitment to Safety

### Winter Preparations:

- Check windows and doors for proper seals
- Clean ducting
- Check furnace filters
- Have your furnace "tuned" / inspected

What Should I Do if I Suspect a Pipeline Leak? **Your personal safety should be your first concern.**

**Evacuate** the area and try to prevent anyone from entering.

**Abandon** any equipment being used in or near the area.

**Avoid** introducing any sources of ignition to the area.

**Call 911** or contact local fire or law enforcement.

**Notify** the 24-hour emergency number – (770) 945-6716.

**Do not attempt** to extinguish a natural gas fire, and do not attempt to operate pipeline valves.

What are the Signs of a Natural Gas Pipeline Leak?

- Blowing or hissing sound
- Dust blowing from a hole in the ground
- Continuous bubbling in wet or flooded areas
- Gaseous or hydrocarbon odor
- Dead or discolored vegetation in an otherwise green area
- Flames, if the leak has ignited
