2007 Street Resurfacing

Each year the City tries to budget \$400,000 for street improvements throughout the City. We prioritize the list using a "Worst-First" system. Street improvements are accomplished in three phases (1) grinding out failed asphalt (2) patching the area (3) final overlay of new asphalt. This process may take several months depending on weather and contractor availability. We will use the following list of streets to be improved until complete or the budget is exhausted.

EE Robinson Park Improvements

EE Robinson Park is in the process of renovating both baseball / softball fields which will give the City some of the best ball fields in North Gwinnett. **Due to this renovation process, the ball fields will be closed starting immediately until the beginning of August to allow the new turf to grow in properly.** We plan on opening these fields as soon as we can to offer baseball and softball leagues to our residents. The City is asking for everyone to remain off the fields during this time in order for us to insure the fields remain clear during the growing process. The park, with new buildings, restrooms, fencing, playgrounds, ball fields, and landscaping should be a benefit to all our citizens.

We need your help to protect your new ball fields from groups playing on them during this time. If you observe any suspicious activity in the park, please call the Sugar Hill Recreation Department (770) 831-7413 or after 5 p.m. call (770) 513-5000 and ask for a Sugar Hill Police Officer to respond immediately to the area. Help us keep your park clean, open, and accessible for you and your family.
