Sugar Hill Street Improvements

New City Limit monuments and street signs:

"Welcome to Sugar Hill" monument signs have been installed on Peachtree Industrial Blvd. at the north and south boundaries of the City. We are coordinating with Georgia DOT to receive authority to place a monument sign on Highway 20 at the intersection with Atwater Court.

Whitehead Road:

The intersection of Whitehead Road & Arbor View Lane will become a **three way stop** on September 1st.

The intersection of Whitehead Road & Balin Lane will become a **three way stop** on September 1st.

Because Whitehead Road is completely developed as a residential street; the speed limit will become **25 mph** on September 1st. This reduction is to improve safety on Whitehead Road.

Construction to install curb and sidewalk on the south side of Whitehead Road has been coordinated with Gwinnett County DOT. This construction has begun and will extend the sidewalk from Sunset to Arbor View Lane. The construction will continue until November.

Co-Ed Flag Football



The City of Sugar Hill and i9 Sports are excited to offer the Sugar Hill community the first Co-ed Flag Football league in Sugar Hill (Ages 5-12). The season begins September 16th and will conclude November 18th at E.E. Robinson Park. All games and practices are played on Sunday afternoons beginning at approximately 1PM. The program is very convenient for our parents. It is ONLY a ONE day 2-hour commitment per player. Our program focuses on FUN, SPORTSMANSHIP, SAFETY, AND INCLUSIVITY which means equal playing time.
