



Gary Pirkle Park Back On Track!

After delays over concerns brought about by the possibility of wetlands on the property; grading and construction work has resumed at Gary Pirkle Park. The City successfully resolved the Army Corp of Engineers issues, and we have been given the greenlight to proceed. The City plans to treat the wetlands as a educational feature with a nature trail, bird houses, native plants and informational signage. The nature trail will join the 1.8 mile walking trail that circles the park.

Sidewalks have been completed in the Hickory Hills sub-division. A Community Development Block Grant was used for construction costs. The City has added 2000 ft. of sidewalks throughout Sugar Hill in 2008.

Mosquito Spraying to Resume in August



The City plans to perform the late summer mosquito spraying in August. The week of August 18th we will spray streets & sub-divisions north of Hwy 20. The week of August 25th we will spray streets & sub-divisions south of Hwy 20. Additional information can be found on the City of Sugar Hill web site home page. You may request to be excluded from spraying by contacting City Hall. The spray becomes inert from water or sunlight, and has been approved by the State Public Health Department.

Housing Authority Considering Home Assistance Program

The City of Sugar Hill, at the request of the Housing Authority, has put forth a program to assist resident home owners in the maintenance and upkeep of their homes. For low income families, and elderly folks living on fixed incomes, keeping up their home is becoming more difficult as costs keep escalating for everyday basics. We have been contacted by several church groups, and volunteer organizations that want to contribute their expertise and manpower to such a project. As we continue to refine the program we will publish updates to this worthwhile mission and ask for citizen input.
