

The City of Sugar Hill
Plaza Security Patrol Actions
Jun.07th, 2016 – Jun.13th, 2016

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal activity reported to them also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are not a police agency.
- 06-07-16- Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business locations, and additional patrols of P.O.A.P.'s for suspicious activity. While on patrol the Officer was dispatched by the on duty Shift Supervisor in reference to a vehicle abandoned on City property. The vehicle was located at Alton Tucker Road and Peachtree Industrial Blvd... Upon arrival the Officer checked the abandoned vehicle for obvious signs that would indicate that the vehicle was stolen. The Officer observed no such signs. The Officer then contacted the GCPD non-emergency line and requested that an Officer be dispatched to his location. Upon the GCPD Officer's arrival the vehicle was checked through both G.C.I.C. and N.C.I.C. to determine if the vehicle was stolen. The vehicle returned not stolen. Due to the fact that the vehicle was on private property the vehicle was not towed. Both units went back in service. No other incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 06-08-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.'s. While on patrol the Officer received a call in reference to the vehicle abandoned near the intersection of Alton Tucker Rd and Peachtree Industrial Blvd. by the off-duty Post Supervisor. The off-duty Post Supervisor had gotten clarification that the property in question was in fact the City of Sugar Hill's... The Post Supervisor requested that the Officer again contact GCPD and request them to put an orange tow away sticker on the vehicle giving the owner 24hours to remove the vehicle or it would be removed at the owners expense. The vehicle was tagged and the Officers then went back on patrol. No other incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 06-09-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 06-10-16- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security personnel.
- 06-11-16- Officer while on patrol made multiple area checks in the city parks. The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties, including P.O.A.Ps. The Officer while on patrol received a call from Lt. Tate Plaza Security LLC in reference to an incident in Wild Timber. The Officer was advised that a person/s, for unknown reasons had cut the plastic tie securing the cable and /or burglar alarm systems boxes to gain access for unknown reasons. While in the boxes nothing was apparently tampered with or stolen. GCPD was on scene when the Plaza Security LLC Officer arrived and advised that they had found nothing. The GCPD Officer as well as the Plaza Security LLC Officer generated incident reports in reference to this incident. No other incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 06-12-16- The Officer performed routine patrols of both business and residential properties including, but neglecting P.O.A.P.'s. The Officer while patrolling the downtown area noticed a suspicious person at the Gazebo. The Officer made contact with the subject at the Gazebo and determined that he needed to leave. The subject complied and left without incident. No other incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security L.L.C. personnel.
- 06-13-16- The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties not neglecting the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.

- POAP: Primrose Creek, Saddle Tree, Whitehead Rd., Westbrook Commons, Pirkle Park
- Multiple patrols performed throughout the following locations due to previous incidents: Pinecrest Station, Kendrix Ridge, Sugar Crossing, Hillcrest Woods, Duncan Town, Sycamore Summit, Frontier Forest, Park View, Sugar Woods, Pine Pavilion Estates, Saddle Tree, Lakefield Forest, Fairview Park, Sugar Hill Plantation, Richland Creek, Creekside at Pinecrest, Cobblestone Park, Spring Hill Plantation, Park at Barrington Estates, Avonley Creek, Cypress Springs, Bent Creek, Hickory Hills and Benfield Road. Patrols also cover all other subdivisions.
