Ring in the new year with a commitment to health at the new E Center gym! Beginning January 2nd, the community will have access to the brand new recreation area and gym including:

- A court striped for basketball, volleyball, and pickleball
- Fitness classes including yoga, dance, and karate
- Indoor walking track
- Fitness equipment including a strength training machine, ellipticals, and treadmills
- New community space for rent

Residents of Sugar Hill will have free access to the gym facilities and other community members can enjoy amenities for an annual fee of \$35.

To register for access to the gym, join a fitness class or league, or rent space in the facility, create an account online at cityofsugarhill.com/recreation and edit your profile information by completing and signing a waiver.

On your first visit to the gym, stop by the reception desk with proof of residency (such as a bill for gas service with the City of Sugar Hill) and have your access card created. Non-residents can process payment with cash, check, or credit card.
