SUBJECT: Hazard Mitigation Plan Adoption



RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve the adoption resolution indicating the city's participation in the Gwinnett County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The two-year long update to the existing hazard mitigation plan is complete and is ready for approval. The County coordinates with multiple jurisdictions in the county to plan ways to reduce exposure and risks associated with hazards in our other emergency management planning documents. This process is part of the requirements determining eligibility for certain grant funding. Over the last year, city and county staff developed updated strategies beneficial to the greater Sugar Hill area with the process wrapping up late last year. Having been through reviews by state and ready for approval at the federal level, staff recommends approval of the attached resolution.

**RESOLUTION
TO INCLUDE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES
AS PART OF THE GWINNETT COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL

WHEREAS, the City of Sugar Hill, Georgia, understands that in order for the City to receive mitigation funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), it must have a mitigation plan in place at the time of submitting a proposal.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SUGAR HILL, GEORGIA, THAT THE CITY WILL WORK WITH GWINNETT COUNTY TO INCLUDE ITS MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES AS PART OF THE GWINNETT COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN.
