## RECOMMENDED ACTION

Authorize the Mayor to sign and submit the application for the 2021 Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant (LMIG) program for improvements to the proposed list provided in the staff memo.

## **BUDGET IMPACT**

The project will be included in the annual capital improvement budget at \$450,000. A portion of the project cost will be funded by state funds, currently estimated to be \$220,528.20 for the next cycle with an additional \$150,000 programmed from SPLOST proceeds in 2021 as well as \$79,471.80 in local funds.

## **DISCUSSION**

The resurfacing program as of late has focused on repairing and resurfacing roads identified in the 2016 conditions assessment in order of priority based on pavement condition, road classification, and other projects in the area. Since 2016, we have completed repairs to nearly ten (10) miles pavement on thirty (30) streets in Sugar Hill. Here are the roads we have completed repairs to in the last five years:

We currently have over 73 miles of paved roads in the city and have thus completed repairs to fourteen (14%) of the entire inventory. With the focus having been on the worst 14 percent, it is anticipated that if construction costs stabilize and inflation somehow mitigated during this economic cycle, the pace of repairs can accelerate through the remaining streets with lesser damage conditions. The recommendation for the annual program will be based on the type of repair, location and cost to determine the best composition of roads that need to be repaired.

Based on the pavement evaluation and staff coordination of recently completed work, we are recommending the following streets be added to the 2020 list for the 2021 program:
