- The Eagle Theatre has a modular removable stage, scene workshops, shipping and receiving docks, grand staircases, concessions, and more
- The E-Center sports a generous storage/entertainment infrastructure by/around backstage
- Taylor Anderson's company has a space in the E-center
- The ground floor opening of the E-Center leads into an upcoming pizzeria
- The Eagle Theatre's Marquee will be arriving/installed in May or Early June
- The Alton-Tucker extension will T West Broad instead of crossing Level Creek and West Broad.
- City Management are more concerned currently with filling the system with tenants in order to remake the cost of the building, while Council Members are pushing for the theater and gym to finish quick because to citizens aesthetics are more important.
- There will be a bridge connecting city hall deck and e-center, and an adjacent staircase leading down to the bowl
