In Recognition of the Suwanee Creek Chapter – National Society Daughters of the American Revolution

WHEREAS, the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution was founded in 1890 and, since its inception, has focused its philanthropic efforts on historical preservation, promotion of education, and encouragement of patriotic endeavor; and

WHEREAS, the Society through its national membership recruitment efforts has developed and is recognized for its expertise in genealogical research; and

WHEREAS, the Suwanee Creek Chapter was organized and chartered on October 8, 2011 and has grown in local membership since its creation; and

WHEREAS, the Chapter has partnered with the City of Sugar Hill and the Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society on many endeavors, including, but not limited to the restoration of the Benson-Kile Family Cemetery, the restoration of the Calaway Family Cemetery, the organization of an annual "Wreaths Across America" ceremony at the Historic Sugar Hill Cemetery, and the organization of the community's annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies; and
