Planning Commission Appointments - Post 3: Julie Adams and Post 4: Jeremy White – Planning Director Awana stated that both commissioners are seeking re-appointment.

Zoning Ordinance Amendment - Readopt Zoning Map, Buffers, Dimensional Standards and Administrative Corrections – Planning Director Awana explained that these corrections to the zoning ordinance are house-keeping to update these sections.

Adopt final plan documents for Sugar Hill Trail Concept Livable Center's Initiative Study – Planning Director Awana explained that the Planning staff have worked through a process to include community involvement, GDOT GwDOT. A draft is on the city's website for review.

**Update Stormwater Management Regulations** – Planning Director explained that this was to be more in line with Gwinnett County and the Metropolitan Water District.

**Public Service Commission, Gas Department Consent Agreement** – Assistant City Manager Besseche explained that the Gas Department was in between the long time Supervisor retiring and the paper system being converted to an electronic system. The fine has been reduced from \$15,000 to \$5,000 with cooperation as outlined in the agreement. Staff will complete training for mock disaster drills and be equipped with the proper equipment to handle these situations.

Emergency Field Repairs, Gary Pirkle Park – Assistant City Manager Besseche explained that the repairs needed are a result of tropical storm Delta which flooded the turf fields and damaged the drainage system. The city's insurance does not cover the fields which are in a flood plain. The city accepted bids and received 3 bids to repair the damage. Precision Turf, LLC was the lowest bid at \$938,283.15. Staff recommends rewarding the contract to Precision Turf, LLC.
