Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society

The Sugar Hill Historic Preservation Society unveiled a new historic marker honoring the Historic Sugar Hill Cemetery. The cemetery, which was affiliated with the city's first Baptist church, predates Sugar Hill's incorporation in 1939. The City of Sugar Hill recently acquired the cemetery and is working to map out graves and restore headstones at the site.

The unveiling ceremony took place on May 28, 2018 and was preceded by a Memorial Day ceremony at the Veterans Memorial in Downtown Sugar Hill. The Suwanee Creek Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution placed wreaths at the memorial in honor of fallen soldiers. Immediately after, attendees placed flags on the graves of Veterans buried in the cemetery. The event ended with a thank you from Mayor Steve Edwards, the marker unveiling and photographs with members of the community, some of whom have lived in the city since 1932.

Associate Pastor of Sugar Hill Church, Bobby McGraw, spoke to the attendees about the connection between the city and the church, "We're honored that the city loves the history of the cemetery. What's very cool is that there is 132 years of connection between the church and the cemetery. And so to think back 132 years to some of the founders that are buried in the cemetery and their lineage that is still part of Sugar Hill Church today. I have no way of knowing if 132 years ago they would have ever imagined what Sugar Hill has become, but what I do know is that they were people that respected the past and had a vision for the future."

This historic marker is the second that the city has placed. The first was dedicated at what is thought to be the oldest home in

Sugar Hill, on Level Creek Road. The city has plans to place more markers throughout the city. As Sugar Hill continues to grow, the ties to history remain strong.

The Spinners Join the 2018 Lineup at The Bowl

Most often thought of as a Motown recording act, the classic group sound of legendary R&B recording artists, The Spinners, has never lost its universal appeal. Throughout the years they have sold millions of records and topped both the Pop and R&B charts with smash hits like "I'll Be Around" and "Then Came You".
