## **Veterans Memorial Ground Breaking Ceremony**

The City of Sugar Hill celebrated the 75th anniversary of D-Day with a ground breaking ceremony for the new Veterans Memorial. Mayor Edwards, city council members, county officials, state and federal elected leaders, American Legion members, Suwanee Creek Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution members, city staff, residents and local veterans were in attendance for the ceremony.

The monument honors the service and sacrifice of members of all six U.S. military branches and features a reflecting pool, eternal flame, and space for the community to gather and remember.




This summer The Bowl will continue to provide world class acts in an intimate award-winning setting.
