Broad St. Concert Band Recipient of Gwinnett Creativity Fund Grant

The Broad St. Concert Band was awarded a \$10,000 grant on Wednesday, October 28th from Explore Gwinnett. The newly announced Gwinnett Creativity Fund grant awards were provided to projects throughout the county demonstrating investment in and programming around visual and performing arts. Sugar Hill's project, an art installation near The Eagle Theatre where the Broad St. Concert Band performs, highlights the value of the arts in Downtown Sugar Hill and the collaborative partnership between the band and the city.

This \$10,000 project grant will complement Broad Street's earlier \$2,500 operations grant and will be used to fund a 3-D, public art installation with lighting.

Gary Pirkle Park Updates

After tropical storms Delta and Zeta caused extreme flooding and debris in the park, our street department worked diligently to assess and begin immediate repairs to the damage. Currently, the walking trails, the restrooms, and pavilion are open to the public at Gary Pirkle Park. The new turf field project continues to make progress, despite nature's efforts to slow it down. The expected completion date is March 2021 and we anticipate i9 Sports and All In Futbol Club at Sugar Hill to be playing on the new fields in the Spring.
