In the spirit of shared curiosity and learning, hundreds of local space enthusiasts attended the event and participated in activities throughout the day, beginning with a rocket launch at Gary Pirkle Park hosted by the Georgia Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, a division of the U.S. Air Force Auxiliary. The afternoon was filled with learning activities including a stomp rocket building and launch session at the E Center and The Bowl. Hundreds of kids watched as rockets soared into the air, launching new interest in space and science. The day of celebration ended with a free showing of the new Apollo 11 film in the Eagle Theatre.
