Additional Statistical Information

On The Stage Children's Theatre (OTSCT) is a year-round working theatre dedicated to education, inclusion, and community engagement through the performing arts.

- During the 2024–2025 season, OTSCT provided 18 part-time teaching positions for industry professionals throughout the school year and created an additional 5 summer jobs for alumni of OTSCT—employing a total of 23 individuals.
- Our current staff includes professionals and alumni from Lanier High School, Brenau University, and Kennesaw State University, among others.
- We are also in the process of developing a partnership with Brenau University to bring
 in additional theatre education staff during the summer months, further strengthening ties
 with local higher education institutions and providing new job opportunities within Sugar
 Hill.

Current Considerations

On The Stage Children's Theatre (OTSCT) is deeply committed to serving the children and families of Sugar Hill. However, our ability to continue growing is currently limited by space constraints.

Our existing facility has reached full capacity, preventing us from enrolling additional students or expanding our programs. We are also in urgent need of a larger **rehearsal area** that would allow our students to safely and effectively learn choreography for our musical productions.

When an adjacent space recently became available, we unfortunately had to decline the opportunity to expand due to the high rental cost. This decision reflected our unwavering commitment to our mission—to never turn a child away because of financial hardship.

We are now hoping to actively seek a larger, affordable space within Sugar Hill that would enable us to:

- Welcome more students into our programs,
- Provide adequate rehearsal space, and
- Further support the City's vision of inclusivity, creativity, and community connection.

On The Stage Children's Theatre (OTSCT) would love to continue partnering with the City of Sugar Hill in its mission to create a more inclusive, welcoming, and creatively vibrant community.

Below are several initiatives we are prepared to implement with the City's support:

1. Theatre in the Schools Initiative

OTSCT is passionate about expanding access to theatre education for local elementary students.

- We were recently contacted by Suwanee Elementary School to develop an after-school theatre program and are currently in the process of fulfilling that request.
- Our goal is to extend similar opportunities to **Sugar Hill elementary schools**, offering daytime performances that align with their fine arts curriculum standards.
- For example, our February 2026 production of Charlotte's Web would be an ideal
 educational performance to invite local schools to attend. We are currently experiencing
 some challenges in coordinating this opportunity within the school systems and would
 greatly appreciate any guidance or partnership from the City on how to bring this idea
 to fruition.
- In addition, we are in discussion to create a Theatre for Young Audiences (TYA)
 program, where our team would visit schools to perform or facilitate in-school
 workshops introducing students to the fundamentals of theatre.

2. Social Interactive Theatre (SIT) Program

A theatre-based program designed to teach social and communication skills to children on the Autism Spectrum through guided performance and play.

- Developed by Renee Hanna at Brenau University in 2012, where it received the Distinguished Achievement Award.
- Successfully piloted for three years by Renee and Bethany Hanna.
- We aim to reintroduce this program as a core offering at OTSCT, providing transformative learning opportunities for children in our community.

3. Sensory-Friendly Performances

We plan to offer sensory-adapted productions designed to meet the needs of children with sensory sensitivities. These performances will provide a fully immersive yet welcoming environment that ensures every child has the opportunity to experience live theatre comfortably.

4. "Table Talk" - Adult Social Program

A monthly social gathering for **adults on the Autism Spectrum**, offering a supportive environment for friendship and connection.

- Inspired by the **Netflix series** Love on the Spectrum.
- Current chapters exist in Smyrna, Dunwoody, and Duluth.
- OTSCT is ready to establish a Sugar Hill chapter, leading this initiative while partnering
 with the City to provide visibility, support, and resources for neurodiverse adults in our
 community.

Through these initiatives and continued partnership, **On The Stage Children's Theatre** seeks to meaningfully enrich Sugar Hill's cultural landscape—promoting inclusion, creativity, and community connection for residents of all ages and abilities.
