## **Sugar Hill Spraying for Mosquitoes**



Each year the City of Sugar Hill dispenses Gwinnett Health Department approved Larvicide tablets in areas of stagnant or standing water to prevent the growth of the mosquito population and reduce exposure to the diseases they transmit. We are in the process of purchasing a portable spraying machine that would allow the City to combat mosquitoes by using a fog spray to apply the insecticide.

Late evenings a City vehicle will drive the streets and spray the insecticide "fog". The fog is sensitive (killed by) sunlight and water. The mosquito spray will accomplish its work over night and the next morning, when the sun comes up, the chemicals are rendered harmless but the process of killing the mosquitoes has taken place.
