Grand Opening: Gary Pirkle Park

The long awaited Grand Opening of Gary Pirkle Park is March 13th at 11am. The 67 acre park features a paved, lighted 1.7 mile walking trail, 255,000 sq ft of synthetic turf (largest in the Southeast), several natural turf grass fields, a 90' playground pavilion with solar power, a concession building, covered viewing pavilions and grandstands. The park has state of the art field lights, a unique covered bridge, several smaller trail bridges and a lighted vehicle bridge. The fields are configured for soccer and can be used for lacrosse and football. An upper parking lot is being finished and will provide access to the fields, bathrooms and grandstands

News Bites:

- The City of Sugar Hill and the Sugar Hill Housing Authority is sponsoring the World Changers Southern Baptists youth mission "hands-on" work experience in Sugar Hill. Mayor Gary Pirkle initiated the contact as a way to improve the well being of some of our citizens, and the Housing Authority had been looking for an avenue to give back to the community. With their sponsorship 180 young adults will come to Sugar Hill July 19-24th to paint, reroof, build handicap ramps and other minor fix up to needy resident families and home owners in Sugar Hill. World Changers national work projects began in the summer of 1990 in Briceville, TN where 137 youth and adults spent a week performed light construction jobs on nine homes. In 2009, World Changers coordinated over 23,000 participants (who pay their own way to participate) at 99 locations on 1,793 work sites and 51 ministry sites. The youths are grouped into teams of 10-12 each with an adult team leader. A project coordinator oversees the teams and develops work schedules. We will be taking applications from residents that need help to maintain their home, or may need some minor repairs.
