The 75th Anniversary Time Capsule Ceremony Celebration

• On Sunday, March 23rd, the City of Sugar Hill 75th Anniversary Time Capsule was closed and placed under the stairwell in City Hall. The enclosure is sealed and a plaque was placed on the wall instructing future generations on when and how to open the time capsule 75 years from now in 2089. We had many city and local dignitaries speak during the event, which also included local Boy Scouts and our two essay contest winners reading their submissions: "Life in Sugar Hill Today" by Kolby Skolnik and "What I Think Life in Sugar Hill Will be Like in 2089" by Nicole Salerno. Copies of the essays were added to the time capsule in addition to photos, documents and memorabilia from the City, an overview of the City, our history, local residents, schools and business. City Going Green!

Clean burning fuels and natural gas are both good for the environment and the City. The City is upgrading some of our vehicles to reduce the amount of gasoline used and emissions produced during normal operations. We are testing this clean fuel source by converting three pickup trucks to dual fuel capability. This means they can run on Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) or regular gasoline. The City installed a "slow fill" station in the City Hall parking deck that can refill the vehicles overnight so they are ready for the next work day. The gas mileage is the same with gasoline or CNG. The advantage is that the CNG costs about half that of commercial fuels. The fueling system automatically switches back to gasoline if the natural gas tank runs empty without any difference in engine power or MPG. If we continue to see positive results the City will purchase CNG vehicles to replace our current fleet as they age out. next to a test vehicle: Councilman Curtis Northrup & City Manager Bob Hail.





Planning for the Future/Joint Training Workshop

As part of the City's efforts to create a vibrant downtown area, the City & the Downtown Development Authority engaged the consulting services of Billy Parrish and Kirby Glaze to provide a customized downtown development training module based on the fundamental principles and practices of the *New* Community Initiated Development© approach. Their engagement included an all-day practical hands-on "Single Project Opportunity Review" workshop to apply the fundamentals taught in the training session to real-life downtown projects selected by the group through a survey conducted last year. This meeting represented the first time that the Mayor and Council, Planning Commission, DDA, and City staff sat together and worked through issues related to fulfilling a mutual goal - building a quality downtown. This effort has helped improve communication and will serve the city and our residents well into the future.

- World Changers here in Sugar Hill in July For the fifth year in a row the World Changers youth mission will be back in Sugar Hill for "hands on" mission work. In coordination with the City and the Sugar Hill Housing Authority, 200 young adults converge on the City to assist families and homeowners in Sugar Hill that may need help maintaining their home. There is no cost to the homeowner, all supplies are paid for by the Sugar Hill Housing Authority, and the young adults supply the labor. In fact they pay their way to come from surrounding states to work on homes. Local churches provide sleeping quarters and feed the workers on site. World Changers national work projects began in the summer of 1990 in Briceville, TN where 137 youth and adults spent a week performing light construction jobs on nine homes. Last year, over 30 Sugar Hill residents applied for help with their homes. The group completed repairs including: house painting, new roofs, handicap ramps, repairing decks and yard clean up at eighteen homes. Applications are available at City Hall.
