Breaking Ground for a New Sugar Hill

September 7th marked a milestone in the development of Sugar Hill's goal of a "new downtown". Our Mayor, City Council and City Manager, joined Reeves Construction management in a ground breaking ceremony for the retention pond that will serve the new City Hall and new development along West Broad. The decorative pond will feature a walking path, bridge, fountains, an amphitheater, terraced seating and landscaping. The pond is the first of a rapid succession of major projects to affect the "new downtown". Construction in Gary Pirkle Park is nearing completion with landscaping around the "Troll Bridge" and the upper parking lot on Suwanee Dam Road. The streetlamps are installed in the upper parking and the pavement has been striped for parking. In E. E. Robinson Park the two intermediate fields are complete. The three "T" ball fields on Level Creek have been graded and electrical and irrigation have been installed. Next will be fences and grass sod.
