

Epic Announcement for Downtown Sugar Hill

Over the past 10 years, the City has actively engaged its citizens to determine what investments or improvements would make Sugar Hill a better place to live. The city has listened and now boasts world class parks, a new city hall and a unique town lawn and amphitheater. The recently completed streetscape has also laid the foundation for future investments downtown. The next move is building a downtown. For the past few years, the city has systematically acquired strategic properties preparing for this moment.

"There is an art to building a City. This strategic and methodical process is like a game of chess where

there are nearly limitless outcomes to consider when making a major move. June 26th was the day that Sugar Hill made just that move," said Mayor Steve Edwards.

On this Thursday evening during the Mayor's Meet & Greet with businesses, residents, and community leaders, Epic plans were announced changing the landscape and improving quality of life of Sugar Hill residents forever. Sugar Hill's next step is to bring a mix of both commercial and residential properties to our downtown. "To show our community how committed we are to bringing people to downtown, we are announcing what we are calling the Downtown Community Center @ Sugar Hill. You are the first to hear these plans and City Council just voted to agree on the terms for this land purchase," said Edwards. The development of this project will take place in a series of planned phases.

Artist's rendering and images of the Downtown Community Center @ Sugar Hill were unveiled and oohs, and ahhs were echoed throughout the crowded room. The Downtown Community Center will consist of a sports gym, lap pool, and a community theatre wrapped with commercial space for restaurants, retail and offices, all to be managed by the city's Downtown Development Authority. Mayor Edwards elaborated stating "the timing is right for this investment considering the impact of the widening of Highway 20. We will see the City become a commercial hub and our goal is to keep commerce, jobs and spending in Sugar Hill. There are 30,000 vehicle trips a day on Highway 20 and once the widening project is completed, DOT is projecting 50,000 trips a day. This is not to mention the traffic currently traveling on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard. Downtown Sugar Hill sits at the epicenter of this commercial hub," said Edwards.

Troy Besseche (*Beb-SESH*), recently named the Assistant City Manager for Sugar Hill, has served local government in the functional areas of Engineering, Community Development, Utility Operations, and Public Works along with several other responsibilities in his tenure with several metro cities. During his 17 years in the public sector, he has implemented key and innovative solutions to municipal operations, ranging from those in Public Works services to Cable & Internet Operations to Code Enforcement. Drawing on his experience in municipal engineering, operations, and project management, he was instrumental in helping establish South Fulton's first successful Stormwater Utility, completed the first major revision to the City of Fairburn's Land Development Standards in the heyday of the housing market, and introduced the concept of Full Depth Reclamation to municipal roadway operations in that City.Besseche, a thirty-year resident of metro Atlanta and Professional Engineer, holds a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from Georgia Tech, a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics Educa-

tion from Georgia State, and completed his secondary education right here in Gwinnett County. He has served on numerous Technical Committees at the regional level and participated in shaping the Georgia Stormwater Management Manual, protected small system's interests during the updates to the three District water resource management plans, and was influential in several transportation studies in the south metro area.

Mosquito Spraying Update

Through the Mosquito Control Program; the City of Sugar Hill is maintaining its efforts to minimize the risk and prevent the spread of mosquito-borne illnesses and reduce human discomfort associated with large mosquito populations in the community. Shortly after midnight, a City vehicle will drive the streets and spray the insecticide "fog". The fog is sensitive (killed by) to sunlight and water. The mosquito spray will accomplish its work over night, and the next morning, when the sun comes up, the chemicals are rendered harmless but the process of killing the mosquitoes has taken place. We have extended our spraying schedule to (2) rounds each year to increase the effectiveness of our Mosquito Control Program. It will take two weeks to spray the entire City for each round of spraying. Please see the spraying schedule below. Late Summer Mosquito Spraying Schedule (Round 2):

Week of August 18th - 22nd Streets & Subdivisions North of Hwy. 20

Week of August 25th – 29th Streets & Subdivisions South of Hwy. 20
