After several months of negotiation and planning, the City is thrilled to announce that a 120' by 60' real ice rink, complete with a covered tent and other rink amenities, will be coming to Sugar Hill starting November 14 and running through February 15. The City will have an entire

lineup of winter activities and programming including

themed nights for schools, churches and little league, recitals, concerts, movies, and our annual Holiday celebration. There will be "Ice Jam" nights for adults, "Skate with Santa", and New Year 's Eve and Valentine 's Day festivities near the closing of the Ice Rink. The Ice Rink @ Sugar Hill will even be open on Thanksgiving and Black Friday. Rental and sponsor options for local businesses, schools and community organizations are available as well.




A 120'x60' real ice rink will be coming to Sugar Hill Nov. 14 through Feb. 15.

Outdoor Burning Rules

Between October 1st and April 30th, the City of Sugar Hill issues permits for residents to burn leaves, limbs and other natural vegetation that falls on your own property. At all times, the burning of any material such as trash, household garbage, plastic, rubber, packing materials and paper is strictly prohibited. A burn permit may be obtained up to two weeks in advance and shall not be issued to the same property for more than two days in a calendar week. For safety and public health reasons, there are distance, size and timing restrictions that are outlined on the permit application. No fee is charged for the permit but a sketch of the burn pile location is required as part of the approval process. In addition to the City of Sugar Hill Municipal Code,

applicants must comply with all County and State regulations pertaining to outdoor burning as well. 

Need to know

We have received some questions recently about the severe weather warning system of observable conditions that may belie the audible warning. The City of Sugar Hill's outdoor storm warning system consists of seven (7) sirens placed strategically throughout the city as a warning device to alert citizens outdoors of imminent severe weather. These sirens are activated automatically across the entire system when the National Weather Service issues alerts for severe weather in the Sugar Hill area, a geographical area established by the NWS. Sometimes, especially with smaller storm cells, not all

of the notification area is affected by the storm. This can conflict with outdoor activities planned or present some interruptions to activities currently



underway, but the City feels that this system is still the best, safest, and most prudent of all options available to us at the present time.
