### Citizen Automated Response & Enforcement System

Sugar Hill citizens may alert City Departments of various concerns, complaints, or information requests through Sugar Hill C.A.R.E.S., a dynamic, web-based citizen relationship management tool. Citizens may visit the City's website at **www.cityofsugarhill.com**, to place non-emergency service requests from anywhere there is Internet access, 24 hours a day. Each entry is automatically assigned an ID number and instantly routed via e-mail to the department responsible for handling the request. Once issues are resolved, the citizens are automatically notified of the outcome. Currently, you may submit Public Works, Stormwater, Parks & Recreation and Planning & Development related service requests including code violations, and other code enforcement type complaints. We will continue to add new service request types to this system, so be sure to visit the website often. Report2Gov is a mobile app where residents may enter their nonemergency service requests using their mobile device. This app is available to both mac and android devices.



### Annual Spring Cleanup

In cooperation with Advanced Disposal, the City of Sugar Hill will be offering a chance to clean out some of the 'junk' in and around the house or neighborhood. During the Week of May 12th on your normal pick-up days, Advanced will collect:

- Broken / Discarded Lawn & Garden Equipment
- Broken / Discarded Appliances (NO refrigerators or freezers)
- Other general debris lying around the yard or basement
- Furniture (Maximum of 3 small pieces)

Be reminded that there are items that we cannot accept, like construction debris and hazardous household waste. Check our website for a list of approved and prohibited items.

# Sugar Hill Recycling



Sugar Hill encourages all our residents to take advantage of the curbside recycling program included with your quarterly fee. We accept newspapers, catalogs, phone books, and magazines, aluminum, bi-metal, tin cans, aluminum, and foil; cereal, laundry, beverage, shoe, and other paperboard box products (free of food waste); all forms of plastic containers including milk jugs and laundry bottles. We no longer accept glass. If you still wish to recycle glass bottles, you can drop them off at the Recycling Bank of Gwinnett at 4300 Satellite Blvd in Duluth.
