# Customer Payment Assistance Program:

In April 2013, the Mayor and Council unanimously agreed and adopted a new policy in which the City of Sugar Hill and the North Gwinnett Co-Op would partner together to offer assistance to individuals and families needing help with paying their gas bill. Since the program began, many families have benefited.

The City's natural gas bill includes a section on the payment coupon that allows customers to add \$1, \$2, \$5, or another amount to their payment to help those individuals and families requiring assistance in paying their utility bill. When a person requests assistance they are directed to the Co-Op where they may apply for a voucher to be credited to their gas utility account. Only customers of the Sugar Hill

natural gas utility are eligible to receive assistance under this program. If you would like more information about

# New Online Payment Site and Automated Phone Payments Now Available!

The City of Sugar Hill has partnered with Paymentus to provide a new online payment platform and automated phone payment system for gas utility payments. Gas bills are payable through: VISA, MasterCard, Discover and e-checks.

- There is no charge to register your account with Paymentus.
- You will be able to manage multiple utility accounts through this interface.
- You may schedule recurring payments through the Customer Dashboard.
- A convenience fee of \$2.25 will be charged by Paymentus per transaction.
- Maximum amount per payment is \$300.00.
   Multiple payments can be made.

All customers are encouraged to use the new payment option by visiting the City of Sugar Hill website and clicking on the "Pay Online" link from the home page. You may setup your utility account through the Customer Dashboard or if you need to make a payment in a hurry without enrolling you may use the one-time payment option.

You may also choose to pay your utility bill over the phone. Simply call City Hall at (770) 945-6716 during normal business hours or call the payment system directly at 855-748-1345. This automated payment system will guide you through the payment process at any time. Please be aware that the convenience fee still applies. Regardless of which payment method you choose, your payment will post to your utility account the next business day.

# **Highway 20 Widening Project**

In spite of the headaches associated with road construction, everyone is pleased to see activity continuing on the Highway 20 widening project. Once completed, the work will represent a significant improvement to traffic flow in the area and will ensure adequate roadway capacity for decades to come. As with this type of transportation project which includes many moving parts, as well as close to a dozen or more utility owners and sub-contractors, the relocation work has experienced some delays.

The general contractor for the project, CW Matthews, has worked diligently, even if unsuccessfully, in opening the first traffic shift from Peachtree Industrial Boulevard to Hillcrest by the original target of the end of 2014. This has been re-scheduled as a result of alignment revisions near Hillcrest by the telephone company and its effects on the earthwork for the roadway construction. Nevertheless, progress continues and more updates will follow as the contractor moves out of utility relocation into full-scale road construction.

On a more positive note, the bridge has cleared the latest permitting hurdle and bridge construction will get underway in earnest in early 2015. This construction marathon's halfway-point looks like it will be in 2016 when the Gwinnett portion of the work starts wrapping up. Here are some key milestones on the project:
