A Special Thanks to Our Street and Stormwater Department

Hurricane Irma wreaked havoc on Gwinnett County. Many were without power for several days and significant damage was done to many homes in Sugar Hill. While schools and businesses were closing and people were busy stockpiling milk and eggs, one group of people was busy working to ensure Sugar Hill roads were cleared as quickly as possible.

The Sugar Hill Public Works staff worked around the clock during the height of the storm, clearing storm drains, removing trees from roadways and right-of-ways and keeping the roads safe for Sugar Hill residents. Staff even spent the night at the city's public works facility to ensure the fastest possible response time. Assistant City Manager Troy Besseche was impressed with the work the staff had completed, saying, "We have one of the best Public Works teams around. They are highly capable, incredibly responsive, particularly diligent, and remarkably courteous folks. Our field staff are some of the most skilled at their position that I

have experienced in my 20 years in local government."

Joe Appling, the city's Street Department Supervisor shared, "The amount of tree debris we picked up and have hauled off, with the two track hoes, is equivalent in size to 100 cement trucks." Of course, all of this work was in addition to the city's routine work throughout the city. Sugar Hill's Public Works Department routinely cleans litter from city streets, cuts and maintains 67 acres of right-of-way and maintains nearly 70 miles of city streets. The department also picks up bagged grass clippings, leaves and yard debris year-round and chips tree limbs and trimmings.

As the Public Works Department adjusts back to their regular routine, City Council and management would like to say thank you to each of them for their hard work and positive attitude.

Local Scout Builds Pollination Garden to Earn Eagle Scout Rank

Winston Williams is a member of Boy Scout Troop 750 out of Auburn. Scouting has been a large part of his life since he was 12 years old. Now, at 18 he has finally completed his Eagle Scout project and his pollination garden is making an impact for the City of Sugar Hill.

Williams began his project at Sugar Hill's Community Garden (SHCG) on August 20, 2017. With a short timeline of only eight days, he was able to gather volunteers and see the project to fruition. Williams' inspiration behind the garden was very personal. "Recently my great grandparents passed away and I wanted to do this project in honor of them," he said. Providing beautiful flowers to the already scenic community garden is certainly a distinguished and permanent way to honor loved ones.

This project, as most, did present some challenges. Williams remembers, "I'm glad I was able to finish the project in the little amount of time I had to complete it. The hardest part of the project other than time was the first few days, it was all grunt work, working out in the hot sun tilling the land and shoveling the gravel was very tough. I'm most proud of how quickly the project actually came to completion; I feel that my

volunteers and [I] worked hard and efficiently." He continues, "The community loves it, I haven't heard one complaint. The garden has been called marvelous, beautiful and helpful." The Volunteer Sugar Community Hill Garden Board agrees with this sentiment. SHCG President, Joanne Billingsley, remarks, "The pollination garden will bring us many positive points to our garden. The bees will pollinate our garden fruits and vegetables, [The pollination garden] provides an organic place for bees to pollinate. It provides us an education for children, as our goal is to have schools bring students over to our garden to educate them on growing your own veggies, fruit and flowers along with how important bee pollination is to our earth."

Williams had one final word of advice for future Eagle Scouts, "Don't procrastinate until two weeks before your 18th birthday to go to the eagle proposal board. It's very stressful. Get it done as soon as you can and make sure you have enough volunteers to carry out your project."
