The City of Sugar Hill Plaza Security Patrol Actions Jul.26th, 2016 – Aug.01st, 2016

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the
 City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded
 immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal
 activity reported to them also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as
 additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are
 not a police agency.
- 07-26-16- Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business locations, and additional patrols of P.O.A.P.'s for suspicious activity. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 07-27-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.'s. While securing the lower parking gate at The Sugar Hill City Hall, the Officer heard seven distinctive reports from a semi-automatic pistol. The firearm being discharged appeared to be in the vicinity of Hillcrest Drive. The Officer drove in the approximate direction from where the sound was originating from. As the Officer drove down Hillcrest Drive he observed a man walking his dog. The Officer stopped and inquired from the subject if he had heard anything. The subject advised he heard seven gunshots from possibility the Hillcrest Glen Drive area. The Officer drove in that direction and was flagged down by a resident that advised that the sound of gunfire came from the cul-de-sac at the end of Pass Court. The Officer then inquired from GCPD Dispatch if they had received any reports of gunshots. The Dispatcher advised no bout would have units in the area just in case. This was also done due to the lack of sufficient protection for the Officer should he encounter the subjects with a gun. The Officer made a thorough search of the area and found 3 subjects near the cul-de-sac on Pass Court in the front yard. The subjects immediately became belligerent so the Officer deescalated the situation and left. The Officer continued patrolling and stopped a GCPD Officer. When asked if the 3 subjects were still in the front yard the GCPD Officer stated no, that they must have gone in after the Plaza Officer's departure. All units went back in service. No other incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 07-28-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols
 included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. No issues or incidents were
 observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 07-29-16- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security personnel.
- 07-30-16- Officer while on patrol made multiple area checks in the city park for suspicious and/ or illegal activities/s. The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties, including P.O.A.Ps. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 07-31-16- The Officer performed routine patrols of both business and residential properties including, but not neglecting the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security L.L.C. personnel.
- 08-01-16- The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties not neglecting the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
