## The City of Sugar Hill Plaza Security Patrol Actions Aug.09th, 2016 – Aug.15th, 2016

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the
  City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded
  immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal
  activity reported to them also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as
  additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are
  not a police agency.
- 08-09-16- Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business locations, and additional patrols of P.O.A.P.'s for suspicious activity. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 08-10-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.'s. While on patrol in the area behind the businesses in The Sugar Hill Station shopping center in a 'blacked out mode' the Officer observed a subject in the dumpster behind the Value Village. The Officer activated his high beam headlights in order to illuminate the subject and disorient the subject. Upon contact with the subject the Officer recognized him from the previous week and in the same location and doing the same things. The Officer obtained the subjects identification and went back to his patrol car and contacted GCPD. This was done because the Officer had received information that the subject was possibly wanted on a Child Support Warrant. After a few minutes two GCPD Units arrived ran the subject on GCIC and NCIC for wants and warrants. The subject returned not wanted and was issued a Criminal Trespass warning by GCPD and was advised by the GCPD Officers if he was caught again that he would be arrested. The subject acknowledged that he understood and left without incident. No other incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 08-11-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols
  included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. The Officer while on patrol
  assisted a stranded motorist at the Shell gas station at the corner of Nelson Brogdon Blvd. and
  Peachtree Industrial Blvd... The Officer exited his vehicle to see if he could assist the subject. He
  was advised by the driver that roadside assistance was en-route to remove an object from her tire
  and repair it. The Officer then returned to service. No other issues or incidents were observed by
  or reported to security personnel.
- 08-12-16- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security personnel.
- 08-13-16- Officer while on patrol made multiple area checks and also the city park for suspicious and/ or illegal activity/s. The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties, including P.O.A.Ps. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 08-14-16- The Officer performed routine patrols of both business and residential properties including, but not neglecting the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security L.L.C. personnel.
- 08-15-16- The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties not neglecting the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
