

The City of Sugar Hill
Plaza Security Patrol Actions
Dec.23rd, 2016 – Dec.29th, 2016

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal activity be reported to them and also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are not a police agency.
- 12-23-16- Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business locations, and additional patrols of P.O.A.P.'s for suspicious /and or illegal activity/is. While locking up Gary Pirkle Park the Officer observed two vehicles behind the trailers in the overflow lot. The Officer proceeded to secure the park and observed the vehicles were still there. The Officer drove over to the location and illuminated the vehicles with the high beams of his patrol vehicle. The Officer observed that one vehicle was empty and that there were three females in the second car. The Officer approached the females and requested their identifications. After confirming all subjects were of age to be out that hour, he advised them that the park was closed and that they were trespassing. The Officer then advised the subjects to leave the property. The subjects complied with the Officer's directions and left without incident. The Officer returned to patrol. While patrolling the Sugar Hill Station and Rite Aid parking lots the Officer caught a glimpse of a suspicious subject ducking into the bushes. The Officer made numerous attempts to make contact with the subject but was unsuccessful and after 45 minutes of searching went back in service. No other incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 12-24-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 12-25-16-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 12-26-16- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 12-27-16- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties looking for suspicious and/or illegal activity/s. This did not exclude the P.O.A.P.'s listed. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 12-28-16- The Officer made routine patrols of the city for suspicious or illegal activity/is. These included business, residential and P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents or issues were reported to or observed by Plaza Security LLC personnel.
- 12-29-16- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties to check for illegal activities. These checks included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.'s. The Officer at 16:30 hours received a call in reference to suspicious activity in the area of Island Ford Road. The Officer monitored the area until 17:00 hours without making contact with any suspicious activity. The Officer then went back in service. No other incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security, L.L.C. personnel
- POAP: Primrose Creek, Saddle Tree, Whitehead Rd., Westbrook Commons, Pirkle Park
- Multiple patrols performed throughout the following locations due to previous incidents: Pinecrest Station, Kendrix Ridge, Sugar Crossing, Hillcrest Woods, Duncan Town, Sycamore Summit, Frontier Forest, Park View, Sugar Woods, Pine Pavilion Estates, Saddle Tree, Lakefield Forest, Fairview Park, Sugar Hill Plantation, Richland Creek, Creekside at Pinecrest, Cobblestone Park, Spring Hill Plantation, Park at Barrington Estates, Avonley Creek, Cypress Springs, Bent Creek, Hickory Hills and Benfield Road, The City of Sugar Hill Splash Park. Patrols also cover all other subdivisions.
