The City of Sugar Hill Plaza Security Patrol Actions Sept.15th, 2017 –Sept.21st, 2017

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the
 City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded
 immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal
 activity be reported to them and also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security
 acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however,
 they are not a police agency.
- 09-15-17- The Officer made routine patrols in various parts of the city, including the business and
 residential properties and not neglecting the P.O.A.P's The Officer received a report of a noise
 ordnance violation in Sugar Crossing. Upon the Officer's arrival at the incident location he spoke
 with the violator who stated that he was finished with his air compressor for the evening and
 discontinued using it. The Officer returned to service. No other incidents were observed by or
 reported to Plaza Security LLC personnel.
- 09-16-17-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also
 included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.'s. No incidents or issues were observed by or
 reported to security personnel.
- 09-17-17-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols
 included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. No issues or incidents were
 observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 09-18-17- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 09-19-17- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties looking for suspicious and/or illegal activity/s. This did not exclude the P.O.A.P's listed. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 09-20-17- The Officer made routine patrols of the city for suspicious or illegal activity/is. These
 included business, residential and P.O.A.P.'s. Limited patrolling due to hazardous conditions as a
 result of tropical storm Irma. Extensive tree debris and power outages. No incidents or issues
 were reported to or observed by Plaza Security LLC personnel.
- 09-21 -17- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties to check for illegal activities. These checks included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.'s. While traveling north on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard the Officer two vehicle and their drivers standing outside their vehicles at the intersection of PIB and 1st Avenue. Believing that it was possibility a Motor Vehicle Accident the Officer made a U turn and headed back to the location, upon his arrival on the scene he asked if anyone was injured. When he was told no by the Drivers they began telling him what had happened. The Driver who was at fault tried to convince the elderly driver to follow him to the Bank and that he would pay for the damage that he had caused on the elderly man's vehicle. Due to the at fault Driver's nervousness and reluctance to have the Police called, the Officer seeing this type of incident occur during his Law Enforcement career insisted on calling GCPD and remained on scene until they arrived. The Officer then contacted the non -emergency number for GCPD and inquired if they had received a report of a two car MVA at PIB and 1st Avenue, the Operator advised no. The Officer then gave all the pertinent information and advised that he would standby until the Units arrived. Upon their arrival the Officer advised the GCPD Officers what he had been told by the at fault driver, in reference that he did not know if his Texas automotive insurance would be valid in Georgia. The GCPD Officers then moved the vehicles to the turn lane just south of Alton Tucker Rd and PIB. The Plaza Security Officer then went back in service since GCPD was working the MVA. No other incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security, L.L.C. personnel
