

**The City of Sugar Hill**  
**Plaza Security Patrol Actions**  
**Mar.23, 2018 –Mar.29, 2018**

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal activity be reported to them and also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are not a police agency.
- 03-23-18- Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties During his patrols the Officer did not observe or have reported to him and incidents or situations.
- 03-24-18-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.s. No incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 03-25-18-Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. The patrols included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.s for suspicious activity. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 03-26-18- Officer made routine patrols of all P.O.A.P.'s, not neglecting residential and business properties. No issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 03-27-18- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties looking for suspicious and/or illegal activity/s. This did not exclude the P.O.A.P's listed. The Site Supervisor obtained an updated version of the patrol area. This was done due to the fact the city is growing at an explosive rate. Copies will be disseminated to the other Officers to better service the citizens of Sugar Hill. While on patrol the Officer observed a vehicle of which had been involved in a serious accident at the intersection of Ga. 20 and Zaxby's? The Officer inquired if the subject needed medical assistance and if GCPD had been notified. The driver declined medical assistance. As the Officer drove behind the Kroger he observed a badly mangled Audi black in color being loaded onto a Willard towing service truck and two GCPD patrol cars. The Officer inquired if this was the second vehicle involved in the accident. The GCPD Officer advised yes and that the driver had fled the scene. The GCPD Officer gave a brief description of the driver and his last known direction of travel. The Plaza Security Officer advised that he would do an area check and if he had contact would contact dispatch. The area was checked with negative results. No other issues or incidents were observed by or reported to Plaza Security LLC, personnel.
- 03-28-18- The Officer made routine patrols of the commercial and residential properties. During these patrols were included the various P.O.A.P's. During these patrols other incidents or nefarious activities were reported to or observed by the Officer.
- 03-29-18- The Officer made routine patrols of both business and residential properties to check for illegal activities. These checks included but were not limited to P.O.A.P.'s. Upon arrival for his tour of duty the Officer was advised of a white male subject acting in an unusual manner at Gary Pirkle Park earlier in the day. The subject described as a early to late 20's scruffy beard and long sleeve shirt and blue jeans was seen exiting to the wooded area and was caught on video surveillance. The subject was followed to the Kroger parking lot and his tag was written down. Displayed was Georgia AGM9120 on silver Infinity with a Forsyth county decal. The anonymous complainant stated the subject just drove up and down the parking isles. When the Plaza Officer inquired id GCPD had been notified he was advised no. Due to the time lapse of the observation the Officer made several patrols of Pirkle Park and the Kroger with negative contact there were no other incidents observed by or reported to Plaza Security, L.L.C. personnel.
- NOTE: All shifts have maintained sporadic and numerous patrols and surveillance of the 1498 Hillcrest Drive (aka the City Barn) location for unauthorized and or nefarious activities as a possible deterrent to future theft and /or damage to Sugar Hill properties.
- POAP: Primrose Creek, Saddle Tree, Whitehead Rd., Westbrook Commons, Pirkle Park
- Multiple patrols performed throughout the following locations due to previous incidents: Pinecrest Station, Kendrix Ridge, Sugar Crossing, Hillcrest Woods, Duncan Town, Sycamore Summit, Frontier Forest, Park View, Sugar Woods, Pine Pavilion Estates, Saddle Tree, Lakefield Forest, Glens at Level Creek, Fairview Park, Sugar Hill Plantation, Richland Creek, Creekside at Pinecrest, Cobblestone Park, Spring Hill Plantation, Park at Barrington Estates, Avonley Creek, Cypress Springs, Bent Creek, Hickory Hills and Benfield Road, The City of Sugar Hill Splash Park. The House on Level Creek and the demolition site on First Ave. Patrols also cover all other

subdivisions. Added to the current list is the Buice School for a period of 90 days due to equipment storage for the Actors Guild.
