The City of Sugar Hill Plaza Security Patrol Actions Nov.28th, 2018 – Dec.04th, 2018

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal activity be reported to them and also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are not a police agency.
- 11-28-18- The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and business properties. This also included, but was not limited to the P.O.A.P.s While on patrol behind the Value Village the Officer observed two females in a white SUV parked by the dumpster. The Officer approached and advised them to put everything back in the dumpster and to leave. The ladies complied and left without incident. While checking the Eagle Theater and E-Center, the Officer encountered 4 unsecured doors. One he tried to secure was but was unable. One of the doors had a piece of cardboard blocking the locking mechanism. After removing the cardboard the door was secured. No other incidents or issues were observed by or reported to security personnel.
- 11-29-18- The Plaza Patrol Officer made several patrols of both residential and business
 properties to include P.O.A.P.'s in search of nefarious or illegal activities. While preforming the
 nightly security check of the Eagle Theater and E-Center an unsecured door was found
 unsecured. The Officer tried to secure it but was able. No other issues were observed by or
 reported to the Officer and he concluded his shift and departed.
- 11-30-18-The Officer made routine patrols of both residential and businesses properties, this including the P.O.A.P.s. The No incidents or issues were reported to /or observed by the Officer.
- 12-01-18-The Officer made patrols of the residential and commercial properties including the P.O.A.P.s. The Officer while checking the Orr Ferry House cable noticed it was down. Upon inspection it was founded that the combination was left unlocked by person/s unknown. While securing the lock, the Officer observed that at some point a person/s had attempted to cut the cable with bolt cutters, but had failed. The Officer took photographs, notified Mr. Sokenis, and the day watch Supervisor and generated an incident report on the SilverTrac system. The Officer was not advised of any other incidents or issues during his tour of duty.
- 12-02-18- The Officer made numerous checks of the business and residential properties, including the P.O.A.P.s. While patrolling in the Brogdon Business Park the Officer observed at Aaron's Plumbing an unsecured chain link fence gate leading to the area where the service vehicles were stored. The Officer checked the padlock to determine if it had been forcibly opened; it had not and had apparently been inadvertently left open. The Officer then contacted the phone number on the sides of one of the service vehicles. The Officer received the after-hours operator and advised of the situation. The operator advised that she would contact the apocopate person to see if the situation needs to be addressed then or could wait. After clearing that issue the Officer found that the chain at the Leland Wood Enterprises, Inc. also was down. The Officer checked the rear of the building including a Con-Dex storage container and found no evidence of foul play. The Officer then contacted the telephone number posted on the front door of the business. The officer spoke to the owner who stated that he sometimes leaves the chain down, but was very pleased that the situation was checked out and was very apperceive that the Officer took the time to inform him. The Officer did not observe any other irregularities or incidents and none were reported to him.
- 12-03-18- The Officer conducted area checks of the residential and business properties this
 included the P.O.A.P.s. During his tour of duty no issues or incidents were observed or reported
 to the Officer.
- 12-04-18-The Officer conducted area checks of the residential and business properties including the P.O.A.P.s. No incidents were observed by or reported to security.
- NOTE: All shifts have maintained sporadic and numerous patrols and surveillance of the 1498
 Hillcrest Drive (aka the City Barn) location for unauthorized and or nefarious activities as a
 possible deterrent to future theft and /or damage to Sugar Hill properties.
- POAP: Primrose Creek, Saddle Tree, Whitehead Rd., Westbrook Commons, Pirkle Park
- Multiple patrols performed throughout the following locations due to previous incidents: Pine crest Station, Kendrix Ridge, Sugar Crossing, Hillcrest Woods, Duncan Town, Sycamore Summit, Frontier Forest, Park View, Sugar Woods, Pine Pavilion Estates, Saddle Tree, Lakefield Forest, Glens at Level Creek, Fairview Park, Sugar Hill Plantation, Richland Creek, Creekside at Pine crest, Cobblestone Park, Spring Hill Plantation, Park at Barrington Estates, Avonley Creek,

Cypress Springs, Bent Creek, Hickory Hills and Benfield Road, The House on Level Creek and the demolition site on First Ave. Patrols also cover all other subdivision. The location known as the Orr's Ferry House located at 6180 Cumming Hwy. Daniel Creek was added on September, 24, 2018. Added were the Eagle Theater and E-Center.
