

The City of Sugar Hill
Plaza Security Patrol Actions
May 03rd. 2020 –May 09th. 2020

- The following actions are specific significant actions taken during normal patrols throughout the City. Plaza Security patrols the City on a daily basis and any criminal act is forwarded immediately to the Gwinnett County Police Department. Security officers request any illegal activity be reported to them and also be reported to Gwinnett County Police Dept. Plaza Security acts as additional eyes and ears for the City and provides assistance when needed; however, they are not a police agency.
- 05-03-20- The Officer conducted patrols and had nothing to report.
- 05-04-20-The Officer conducted patrols and had nothing to report.
- 05-05-20-The Officer made routine patrols and had nothing to report.
- 05-06-20-The Officer made patrols and had the following to report:
INCIDENT TYPE: (1) The Officer encountered a subject at the pond adjacent to the Bowl with a leashed dog. The Officer mistakenly confronted the subject due to his confusion with the signage posted at the lower parking area of City Hall. The signage reads “NO PETS “. The Officer advised he thought that meant all the Bowl area. He was directed by his immediate Supervisor that this signage was intended for Bowl events only and that properly behaving dogs licensed and on leashes were permitted around the pond and in the Commons are of the E-center as long as their owners cleaned up after them.
(2) Noise Complaint- At 23:45 hours the Officer received a call from the on Duty Supervisor. The Shift Supervisor advised that they had received a call from The Wild Timber Subdivision in reference to a complaint of a subject performing construction activity. The complainant advised that the subject resided at 451 Spring Willow Drive. Upon arrival the Officer after a few minutes made contact with the Resident. The Officer was advised that the Resident was remodeling the basement and was unaware of any restrictions on construction. The Officer advised the Resident, that no construction noise was to be performed after 7:00 pm. The Officer also advised the Homeowner to contact Sugar Hill City Hall during normal business hours and they could provide clarification on the construction activities restrictions and any other Code Enforcement Issues. The Homeowner agreed and discontinued further construction activities.
- 05-07-20- The Officer made patrols and had nothing to report.
- 05-08-20- The Officer made patrols with the following to report:
INCIDENT TYPE: Extra Patrol Request. The Officer was advised by Matthew Phillips, with Sugar Hill Recreation Department pertaining to the fact that the Gary Pirkle Park was again open for people to use. The Officer was advised to periodically check the areas to ensure social distancing and no large groups were gathering.
- 05-09-20- The Officer made patrols and reported the following.
INCIDENT TYPE: Burning Ban Violation 2nd- While on patrol the Officer received a call from a resident in the Sugar Hill Plantation Subdivision in reference to violation of the Burning Ban. Upon arrival in the subdivision the Officer quickly located the residence in question and observed a small pile of brush burning just west of the residence located at 1021 Shelby Lynn Court. Upon making contact with the Resident, the Officer advised that there is an existing Burn Ban until September. The Officer went to the extent of showing the Resident on the internet pertaining to the Burn Ban. The Resident extinguished the fire and apologized for his actions.
- NOTE: All shifts have maintained sporadic and numerous patrols and surveillance of the 1498 Hillcrest Drive (aka the City Barn) location for unauthorized and or nefarious activities as a possible deterrent to future theft and /or damage to Sugar Hill properties.
- POAP: Primrose Creek, Saddle Tree, Whitehead Rd., Westbrook Commons, Pirkle Park
- Multiple patrols performed throughout the following locations due to previous incidents: Pine crest Station, Kendrix Ridge, Sugar Crossing, Hillcrest Woods, Duncan Town, Sycamore Summit, Frontier Forest, Park View, Sugar Woods, Pine Pavilion Estates, Saddle Tree, Lakefield Forest, Glens at Level Creek, Fairview Park, Sugar Hill Plantation, Richland Creek, Creekside at Pine crest, Cobblestone Park, Spring Hill Plantation, Park at Barrington Estates, Avonley Creek, Cypress Springs, Bent Creek, Hickory Hills and Benfield Road, The House on Level Creek and the demolition site on First Ave. Patrols also cover all other subdivision. The location known as the Orr’s Ferry House located at 6180 Cumming Hwy. Daniel Creek was added on September, 24, 2018. Added were the Eagle Theater and E-Center. This P.O.A.P. will focus on unauthorized persons in the parking decks, in particular subjects loitering, skateboarding, or sitting in their vehicles for long periods of time.
